Citrus Logistics and Vessel Status Update

Issues and developments regarding the exporting of citrus at this time -

- 1. We have created a short survey to ascertain the status of operations in a few key areas. Please be so kind to complete the survey that should take no more than 2 minutes to complete. Link: <u>https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/KHJ6LR9</u>
- 2. Summary of telecom held with TPT 4 May -
 - 2.1. Terminal capacity: DCT, Point, PECT, CTCT and CTMPT terminals at high capacity at the moment. TPT are gearing to add an additional berth to NCT line up shortly. NCT impacted by high number of staff with chronic ailments. TPT guided by government regulations regarding staff members permitted to work and those that have to be in isolation. It was noted that CTCT is the terminal that is under most pressure from a vessel berthing perspective at this time.
 - 2.2. PECT MHC: awaiting training of operators, should be in commission by June.
 - 2.3. Procedure for positive COVID-19 case at terminals: Transnet HR have issued a procedure in this regards, CGA will be required to submit a formal request to receive a copy of the procedure. If there is a positive case found, terminal operations would be impacted for a short time to conduct sanitization. All staff are tested with temperature devises on arrival to work, staff that have high temperatures are sent for immediate testing.
 - 2.4. DCT truck appointment system: truck appointment system was implemented to manage the flow of trucks to DCT given that the terminal landside is not operating at full capacity. It has been acknowledged that there is some additional development required to create flexibility in the booking slots and arrival window. This is due to truck appointment slots not being met because of various delays in the chain. TPT will look to increase the arrival window as well as create separate bookings for GP and Reefer containers.
 - 2.5. Reefer plug point capacity at terminals: it was noted that the 600 reefer slots planned for NCT will not be installed. Instead, Gensets will be brought up from Cape Town and installed for 120 reefers. These will be used to clear trucks at the staging area during windbound.
 - 2.6. Reefer forecast: TPT has called on shipping lines to provide accurate reefer volume forecasts for better management and planning of reefer capacity and dwell times at terminals. This is an essential part of minimizing over extending reefer plug capacity. CGA encouraged TPT to engage with PPECB to interface with the online Q67 booking system to obtain information on reefer packing data.
 - 2.7. Container depots: TPT appealed to CGA to engage with container depots to operate on a 24-hour basis to permit containers to be packed over a wider time slot. It has been noted that depots are not operating proper hours and are closing early preventing reefer containers from being collected. CGA appealed to TPT to fast track the port community system that TPT have agreed on developing. The system would synchronize all stakeholders and planning activity to a central framework.

2.8. TPT and CGA will engage on a regular basis to confer on developments and matters that require urgent intervention.

These issues are being elevated to national government for resolution. This has been an immeasurable method that has be used to resolve many constraints that have been reported to the CGA.
