CGA Directors are elected to represent their regions for a period of two years. After two years the region is asked to nominate a director (or directors) for their region. Present directors can be re-elected. Three regions have two directors – Letsitele, Senwes and Sundays River.

For the period April 2023 to March 2025 seven regions elected their directors. In all regions the present directors were available to continue, and in all cases the directors were re-elected unopposed.

George Hall has been re-elected for the Boland region – George is now serving his twenty second year on the CGA Board (many years on the Executive Committee). Mike Woodburn begins year seventeen as representative of KZN on the CGA Board. Cornel van der Merwe will continue to represent Onderberg – now in his eleventh year on the Board (also present Vice Chairman, past Chairman and many years on the Executive Committee).

Andrew Muller will be hitting a milestone in 2023 having represented Nelspruit for ten years. Both Marius Bester (Northern Cape) and Gerrit van der Merwe (Western Cape and CGA Vice Chairman) will be serving their regions for the seventh year.

Relative newcomer Smit Le Roux will be representing Burgersfort Ohrigstad for the fourth year.

These directors will join existing Board members whose tenure will come up for renewal end March 2024 – Hannes de Waal and Hennie Ehlers (Sundays River); Andries van Wyngaardt and Jan Louis Pretorius (Letsitele), Charles Rossouw and Piet Engelbrecht (Senwes); Guy Whitaker (Limpopo River); Jock Danckwerts (East Cape Midlands); Paul Bristow (Zimbabwe); Per Noddeboe (Eswatini); Phillip Dempsey (Patensie) and Tommie Landman (Hoedspruit); as well as Eric Nohamba, Bennet Malungane, Rajen Govender and Vangi Titi. <u>CGA CITRUS SUMMIT</u>
