GROWER INDABA: PORTS

The CGA is a member-driven organisation, unashamedly catering for the needs of citrus growers in southern Africa. As we approach the 2024 citrus season, growers are concerned about the ability of the ports to handle the ever increasing citrus volumes. 2023 Proved to be a good year in terms of getting citrus volumes through the ports, but many challenges arose as the pome and table grape industries started their season. There is legitimate concern regarding readiness for the 2024 citrus season.

The CGA has been engaging with Transnet and have seen a focus on improving port performance. A group of growers have called for a Port Indaba – and the CGA have heeded this call. This will give grower members of the CGA the opportunity to hear what is being put in place in readiness for the 2024 season. It will also be an opportunity for grower members to assist the CGA in ensuring that all aspects of port logistics have been considered. An invitation has been sent to all growers and more information will be sent once arrangements are firmed up.

MSC's ADDITIONAL SERVICE FROM EASTERN CAPE TO EUROPE WELCOMED

This additional service is good news for Eastern Cape citrus growers. Our members in Patensie, the Sunday's River Valley, and Kat River who export their high-quality citrus to Europe will be able to make use of this option, which helps to protect jobs and much needed foreign revenue for the country.
